ADDENDUM 1 TO INFORMATION BOOKLET FOR APPLICANTS FOR INTERNATIONAL PROTECTION (IPO 1)

Section 8 - Your Rights and Obligations in the International Protection Process

Access to the Labour Market

From 9 February 2018, an international protection applicant will be able to access the labour market in two ways:

- **1.** All applicants for international protection can apply to the *Department of Business*, *Enterprise and Innovation* for an **employment permit**. This is an existing scheme and the same conditions for eligibility will be applied to a protection applicant as for all other non-EEA nationals. Full details can be found on the Department's website www.dbei.gov.ie by following the link to 'Employment Permits'.
- 2. The *Minister for Justice and Equality* has set up an administrative scheme to provide eligible international protection applicants with **permission to be self-employed**. To be eligible for this scheme a protection applicant must, on the date they apply for a permission under the scheme, be waiting on a first instance recommendation on their protection application for 9 months or more. A protection applicant must also have made reasonable efforts to establish their identity and have co-operated with, and not otherwise delayed the protection process. If on 9 February 2018, a protection applicant has already received a first instance recommendation on their protection application, they are not eligible for this scheme.
